

NELLY'S NONFICTION MAP

1. It is recommended that this chart be laminated for continuous use.
2. Select a short, simple non-fiction text or use the book Baby Xander.
3. Tell students that they will need to make a picture in their heads as they listen to a story read aloud to them.
4. Prepare to read a selected nonfiction text or utilize the information learned from Baby Xander.
5. After hearing the story, students complete Nelly's Nonfiction Map.
6. Depending on ability, students will write or draw in order to complete the chart.
7. This chart can then be used for future nonfiction readings done at home if it is laminated.
