

ON THE SAFARI

1. Using the **On the Safari** book, students should complete a picture walk to look at the jungle scenes, which depict the setting found in the book.
2. Students can then use the A-Z animal sheet found in the phonemic awareness folder to select animals to add to their story scenes.
3. After selecting animals, students will then practice their oral story telling by creating a story using both animals and setting.
4. Oral rehearse is essential for developing both reading and writing skills.
