ON THE SAFARI

- 1. Using the **On the Safari** book, students should complete a picture walk to look at the jungle scenes, which depict the setting found in the book.
- 2. Students can then use the A-Z animal sheet found in the phonemic awareness folder to select animals to add to their story scenes.



- 3. After selecting animals, students will then practice their oral story telling by creating a story using both animals and setting.
- 4. Oral rehearse is essential for developing both reading and writing skills.
