THREE LITTLE KUDUS

- 1. Prepare to read the Three Little Kudus orally to students.
- 2. Tell students that they will need to make a movie in their heads as the story is read to them.
- 3. Prepare the pictures from the Three Little Kudus Table that go along with the Three Little Kudus story.
- 4. As the story is read show students the 8" x 11" pictures that correspond to what you are reading.
- 5. After reading the story, have students use their Three Little Kudus Table cut-outs to choose a picture for the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
- 6. Mix them up and place them on the story elements board.
- 7. Ask students to correctly order the pictures and tell what is happening in each picture
